- 6. If appointed to the Commission, you will be ineligible to hold a partisan elected office at the state, county, village, or township level in Michigan for five (5) years following the completion of your service. Do you understand that by serving on the Commission you are ineligible to hold these elected offices for five (5) years?
- Serving on the Commission will require a time commitment of more than one year, on a varying part-time and full-time basis (approximately 20 – 40+ hours per week). Are you able to dedicate the necessary time to fulfill your duties as Commissioner in addition to your other personal and work obligations?
- The salary of a commissioner is set by law at approximately \$40,000 per year. Being a commissioner also requires travel to public hearings across Michigan. With these financial and travel expectations in mind, will you be able to serve on the commission?
- 7. The Michigan constitution states, "each commissioner shall perform his or her duties in a manner that is impartial and reinforces public confidence in the integrity of the redistricting process." If selected, are you able to conduct yourself accordingly?
- 10. The Commission will be comprised of 13 commissioners: 4 commissioners who identify as Republican, 4 commissioners who identify as Democrat, and 5 commissioners who do not identify with either major party.
